Project Description




183 North Mobility Project

- Approx. 9-miles on US 183
- Additional operational improvements south along MoPac including a direct connector
- Two express lanes in each direction
- Widening to four non-tolled lanes in each direction
- Bike and pedestrian improvements


Project Purpose


- Facilitate congestion management in the corridor
- Provide reliable route for transit
- Facilitate reliable emergency response

Previous Actions

CAMPO

- Lists this section of the US 183 corridor as one of the top congested roadways
- Prioritized a \$7.2 million funding allocation from CAT 7 for preliminary work (December 13, 2011)

Mobility Authority

- Environmental Clearance (April 26, 2016)
- Primacy (April 26, 2017)
 - State law provides that the Mobility Authority, as a "local tolling entity," has the first option to develop, finance, construct, and operate any new toll project. This option is commonly referred to as "primacy"

Project History




Previous Actions (cont.)

TxDOT

- Texas Transportation Commission (TTC) approved funding up to \$104.2 million for non-tolled elements (January 2019)
- Extension of primacy (new deadlines)
 - April 2019 Advertisement of Initial Procurement (RFQ)
 - October 2020 Enter into Contract for Construction



TxDOT Review/Approval

NEPA Reevaluation

- US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS)
 Formal consultation and additional operational improvements along MoPac require NEPA reevaluation
- TxDOT Review/Approval

USFWS Formal Consultation

- TxDOT/USFWS Review
- USFWS issues Biological Opinion, including conservancy mitigation measures



Regional Planning Document Updates



- 3-Step Process: Updates required due to shift in funding to TxDOT federal dollars and cost of additional MoPac operational improvements
 - Update Unified Transportation Program (UTP) Texas Transportation Commission approves UTP
 - Update Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) TxDOT and CTRMA work together to update the TIP (Administrative approval)
 - 3. Update Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) TxDOT and CTRMA work together to update the STIP (Administrative approval)



Project Development Agreement



Project Development Agreement (PDA) defines the partnership between TxDOT and CTRMA

- CTRMA and TxDOT staff will work to develop
 - Requires CTRMA Board approval
 - Requires TxDOT Executive Director approval



FHWA Compliance Documents



- Complete Cost Estimate Review (CER) and Financial Plan
 - Review the initial costs estimates prepared during NEPA, which includes the identification, analysis and quantification of all potential risks
 - Develop an Initial Financial Plan (IFP) to provide a reasonable assurance that there
 will be sufficient financial resources available to implement the project as planned.
- Prepare and receive approval for Project Management Plan (PMP)
 - A requirement for a Major Project (\$500+ million) receiving federal funding, the PMP will provide guidance to all relevant parties, clearly designating assumptions and decisions regarding management processes, approvals, dispute resolutions and overall project control



Financing



Revenue Bonds

 Finalize the Traffic & Revenue (T&R) Study; Prepare Engineering Report; Prepare Preliminary Official Statement (POS); CTRMA receives final price from the design-build contractor; CTRMA requests Investment Grade rating; POS finalized; Issue bonds

TIFIA Loan

- Update Letter of Interest (LOI); Provide near investment grade Traffic & Revenue (T&R) results to TIFIA; CTRMA requests Investment Grade rating
- Loan funded one year after project complete Bond Anticipation Note (BANs) short term bonds, issued to cover costs until TIFIA financing is available



Design-Build Procurement



- Issue Request For Qualifications (RFQ) Begins the "no contact" period
- Teams submit Statement of Qualification (SOQ); Develop shortlist of proposers
- Request Board Approval to issue Request For Detailed Proposals (RFDP) from the shortlisted proposers
- Request Board Approval for Executive Director to negotiate and bring to Board a final Design-Build Agreement
- Negotiate Design-Build Agreement; Request Board approval for value of Payment for Work Product



Design & Construction




- Issue Notice To Proceed-1 (NTP-1) to Design-Build Contractor to submit contractually required documents; Design-Build Contractor provides all obligated documentation
- Issue NTP-2 to authorize Design-Build Contractor to begin design and construction
- Construction is completed Open to tolling
