Manor Expressway Construction Prompts Temporary Lane Closures US 290 and Giles/Johnny Morris Road intersection will be closed starting September 4th

(Austin, Texas) – The Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority today announced temporary lane closures, as construction of the Manor Expressway continues in eastern Travis County.

Starting September 4th the following lane closures will go into effect:

- The intersection of US 290 and Giles/Johnny Morris Road will be temporarily closed to traffic between eastbound and westbound US 290 for approximately 4-6 weeks.
- Southbound Giles/Johnny Morris traffic will be detoured west on US 290 to the newly constructed turnaround just east of Springdale at Arterial A.
- Northbound Giles/Johnny Morris traffic will be detoured to the east on US 290 to the Harris Branch turnaround. The intersection will be closed for approximately four to six weeks.
- On Wednesday, September 4th from 6 p.m. to 5 a.m., access to and from Giles at US 290 will be blocked. Southbound Giles traffic will be detoured to Blue Goose and then to Harris Branch to access US 290. Eastbound and northbound traffic wishing to access Giles will be detoured east on US 290 to Harris Branch, follow Harris Branch Blvd. to Blue Goose, and take Blue Goose to connect to Giles.
