## Toll Rates Changing on 183A Expressway

(Austin, Texas) – The Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority will increase tolls on the 183A Expressway by 1.52% effective January 1, 2014. This inflation-based adjustment will add eight cents to the cost of a full-length trip on 183A for customers with TxTag. The increase at individual tolling locations will vary. The Lakeline Main Plaza will increase from \$0.51 to \$0.52, the Crystal Falls Main Plaza will increase from \$0.97 to \$0.99 and the Park Street Main Plaza will increase from \$1.38 to \$1.40. Rates for Pay by Mail customers will increase by 1.99%.

The increase is part of a Mobility Authority policy that adjusts rates annually in line with inflation to avoid larger increases every five years.

The toll rates on the Manor Expressway (290 East) will not increase on January 1. Those toll rates will be adjusted later in 2014 when the entire length of the Manor Expressway is open to traffic, in accordance with the toll charge schedule adopted by the Mobility Authority Board of Directors.
