Toll Operations Expert Joins Mobility Authority Staff

(Austin, Texas) – Experienced toll industry veteran Tim Reilly has joined the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority as Director of Operations. Reilly, a 35-year toll industry veteran, will be responsible for overseeing procurement, design, implementation, operation and maintenance of toll collection systems on all of the Mobility Authority's projects including 183A and the Manor Expressway. Reilly will also be responsible for overseeing the Mobility Authority's Pay By Mail video billing program and violation enforcement process.

Prior to joining the Mobility Authority, Reilly served as a Program Manager with engineering firm PBS&J in support of toll collection on the Central Texas Turnpike System. Prior to that, Reilly was PBS&J's Program Director for the North Texas Tollway Authority's (NTTA) all-electronic toll collection system conversion program. Between 2004 and 2008, Reilly was an Assistant Program Manager with PBS&J and supported development of the Central Texas Turnpike System and deployment of TxTag.

Before joining PBS&J, Reilly worked as Director of Operations for the Maryland Transportation Authority (MdTA), where he oversaw the activities of 730 employees involved with toll collection, maintenance, traffic management and administration for seven toll facilities. He also oversaw installation and operation of the agency's electronic toll collection system and a traffic operation center.

"Tim Reilly has an incredible amount of experience," says Mobility Authority Executive Director Mike Heiligenstein. "His extensive work on innovative programs such as all-electronic tolling makes him an incredibly valuable addition to our organization."
