Founding Board Member to Leave Mobility Authority

(Austin, Texas) – Johanna Zmud, one of the founding members of the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority Board of Directors, has decided to step down from her position after more than three years of service to the community. In submitting her resignation to Travis County Judge Sam Biscoe, Zmud cited changes at her company, NuStats for her decision to leave. NuStats was recently acquired by a European-based traffic and mobility firm, PTV-AG.

“To fulfill my obligations to my firm’s new owner, I need to be able to pursue contract opportunities in Texas that I currently cannot and will also need to dedicate significant time to domestic and international business travel, which prevents me from devoting the time necessary to fulfill my responsibilities as an active board member,” says Zmud.

Zmud was appointed to the Mobility Authority Board by the Travis County Commissioners Court in December 2002 when the agency was first created, and helped guide the Mobility Authority through its formative years. Zmud served as Chair of the agency’s Planning Committee and played a vital part in the success of its first major project, the 11.6 mile, \$238 million, 183A toll road. She also helped raise awareness about the transportation funding challenges facing Central Texas and has advocated the need for and benefits of toll roads.

“I never thought I would ever leave the CTRMA board,” says Zmud. “I truly believe in its mission and its promise of fulfilling that mission.”

Zmud has not set an official resignation date and expects to continue her service until the Travis County Commissioners Court appoints her replacement.
