#### I. Welcome, Opening Remarks and Board Member Comments

# First Amendment To Employment Agreement Between Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority And Mike Heiligenstein

This First Amendment to the Employment Agreement Between Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority ("CTRMA") and Mike Heiligenstein ("Employee") is made effective as of the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2007, and is for the purpose of amending Paragraphs 3.1, 3.2, 4.1, 4.2, and 4.3 of the Employment Agreement Between CTRMA and Employee effective January 10, 2006.

Pursuant to action of the CTRMA Board of Directors, Paragraphs 3.1, 3.2, 4.1, 4.2, and 4.3 of the Agreement are amended as described below.

#### Paragraph 3.1 is amended to read as follows:

<u>Term.</u> Employee's employment under this Agreement is effective as of the Effective Date and will continue in effect until the sixth anniversary of the Effective Date, unless Employee's services are terminated in accordance with <u>Section 3.2</u> ("Initial Term"). At the end of the Initial Term, the parties may agree to renew, extend, or modify the Agreement, execute a new agreement, or terminate their relationship. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the parties may agree to conduct an Optional Review (as defined in <u>Section 4.1(b)</u>) at any time prior to the expiration of the Initial Term.

#### Paragraph 3.2(c) is amended to read as follows:

Termination by CTRMA without Cause. Employee's employment hereunder may be terminated by CTRMA at any time without Cause by the delivery to Employee by CTRMA of a written notice of termination. Upon such termination, Employee will be paid such Base Salary, benefits and any other payments, if any, as have accrued under this Agreement through the effective date of termination. In addition, if Employee's employment is terminated without Cause as provided in this Section 3.2(c) during years one or two of the contract term, Employee shall be entitled to receive as severance compensation the Base Salary for a period of 180 days after the effective date of termination. If Employee's employment is terminated without Cause as provided in this Section 3.2(c) during year three of the contract term, Employee shall be entitled to receive as severance compensation the Base Salary for a period of 270 days after the effective date of termination. If Employee's employment is terminated without Cause as provided in this Section 3.2(c) during years four or five of the contract term, Employee shall be entitled to receive as severance compensation the Base Salary for a period of 360 days after the effective date of termination. If Employee's employment is terminated without Cause as provided in this Section 3.2(c) during year six of the contract term, Employee shall be entitled to receive as severance compensation the Base Salary for a period of 540 days after the effective date of termination.

#### Paragraph 4.1(a) is amended to read as follows:

Effective as of January 10, 2007, the base salary payable to Employee shall be \$15,833.33 per month (or \$190,000.00 per year) (the "Base Salary"), which shall be payable, less applicable withholding for federal and other required taxes, in biweekly installments or otherwise in such manner as the salaries of other employees of CTRMA are paid in accordance with CTRMA's standard payroll procedures, but not less frequently than monthly.

#### Paragraph 4.2 is amended to read as follows:

<u>Bonus.</u> On or after January 10, 2007, Employee shall be paid a bonus of \$30,000.00. Future bonuses, if any, may be awarded at the discretion of the Board of Director, provided any such bonuses are paid out of operating revenue of the Authority and not out of funds from public sources.

#### Paragraph 4.3(b) is amended to read as follows:

Insurance Coverage. Employee and, to the extent applicable, Employee's family, dependents and beneficiaries, shall be allowed to participate in all benefits, plans and programs, including improvements or modifications of the same, which are now, or may hereafter be, available to employees of CTRMA generally. Such benefits, plan and programs may include, without limitation:, (i) health and dental insurance, or healthcare and dental care plans (including a flexible benefits plan that allows pre-tax medical and dental deductions); and (ii) group life insurance and accidental death and disability ("AD&D") coverage, voluntary supplemental life and AD&D insurance, and long term disability coverage. Employee shall be provided with life insurance coverage available for up to \$3000 per year in annual premiums.

#### Paragraph 4.3(j) is added to read as follows:

Financial Planning Services; IRS-Qualified Expenditures. Employee shall be entitled to a one-time payment of up to \$5000.00 for financial planning services. The amount of the payment shall be a reimbursement of the actual cost (up to \$5000.00) as supported by invoices provided by Employee. Additionally, Employee shall be entitled to an annual payment of \$5000.00 for certain IRS-qualified expenditures, including without limitation financial plan maintenance, legal advice/counsel, document preparation (will, power of attorney, advanced health care directive, etc.), and non-covered medical and dependent care expenses.

By their signatures below, the parties to the Agreement evidence their agreement to these amendments set forth above.

# Approval of Work Efforts Report 183-A Turnpike Comprehensive Development Agreement (CDA) Design & Construction Oversight 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2007

#### Introduction:

As detailed in the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority (CTRMA) Resolution No. <u>04-52</u> and the General Engineering Consultant (GEC) Work Authorization No. 4, the GEC is required to provide quarterly reports to the CTRMA and its Board of Directors detailing the CDA oversight work and expenditures and to obtain board approval for the scope of work and budget for the next quarter.

This report details the CDA oversight tasks performed over the past quarter and the CDA oversight tasks to be performed over the next quarter.

The expenditure on CDA oversight to-date is approximately \$13,230,000. The currently approved expenditure is \$13,494,000. The GEC anticipates expending \$ 948,000 over the next quarter and therefore requests the Board to approve the remaining amount of WA #4 of \$14,178,080.

#### CDA Oversight Tasks Performed over the Past Quarter (from January 1, 2007 to March 31, 2007):

- Monitor punch list items.


### Anticipated Expenditures and Adjustments of the Not to Exceed Amount for Next Quarter (from April 1, 2007 to June 30, 2007):


The GEC currently anticipates expending the remaining amount of WA #4 from April 1, 2007 to June 30, 2007 on the CDA oversight efforts, resulting in an <u>anticipated cumulative expenditure total of \$14,178,080.00 thru June 30, 2007.</u>

This authorization is to increase the previously approved Not to Exceed Amount of \$ 13,494,000.00 on the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Authorization by \$684,080.00 to meet a maximum expenditure allowed total of \$ 14,178,080.00.

"S-curve" charts have been developed to graphically illustrate the anticipated expenditures over the duration of the associated activities; these charts are attached hereto as Exhibits 1 and 2. The first Exhibit, titled "Exhibit 1: Anticipated CDA Oversight Expenditures Original S-curve", contains a S-curve representing the anticipated expenditures (per the staffing plan established during the development of Work Authorization #4 in October 2004 with a revised adjustment in December 2005) of the total CDA oversight budget of \$14,178,080.95 thru June 1, 2007. The second Exhibit, entitled "Exhibit 2: Anticipated CDA Oversight Expenditures thru 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter S-curve", presents the anticipated expenditures thru June 30, 2007. The actual expenditure figures to date are also presented on these S-curves. As of March 31, 2007 the GEC will have expended approximately \$13,230,000 of the approved expenditure total of \$13,494,000.00.

The re-evaluation will focus on design changes at the proposed intersection of 183A and CR 274. This intersection was not previously addressed in the FEIS or in the subsequent re-evaluation.

The scope of the re-evaluation is based on the following assumptions:

## Assumptions

- The projected average daily traffic (ADT) of 183A is less than 140,000, therefore a
  qualitative MSAT analysis will be prepared for the re-evaluation.
- Based upon guidance from TxDOT Environmental Affairs Division (ENV) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the re-evaluation, including any direct, indirect, or cumulative impacts analysis, will only focus on the proposed interchange of 183A and CR 274.
- The re-evaluation will assess three possible location options of the CR 274 interchange.
- Any request or requirement to address impacts or design changes other than those associated with the proposed intersection of 183A and CR 274 would be considered out of scope and a supplemental work authorization would be required.
- Agency review times will be coordinated by TxDOT-ENV.

#### FEIS Re-evaluation Tasks

## Data Collection

The Engineer will review the FEIS and previous re-evaluation for 183A for the history of the project, consistency with purpose and need, and design changes. The Engineer will also perform data collection and site reconnaissance visits within the existing ROW, upon notice to proceed to

supplement data needed to complete the re-evaluation. The Engineer will obtain or update periodically publicly available information and perform site investigation including:

- · Locations of public buildings, schools, churches, parks, etc.
- · Historic-age structures
- · Aerial/Infrared photography, if available.
- · National Wetland Inventory Maps.
- Site Review for presence of non-inventoried wetlands.
- · County Soil Survey Maps.
- TCEQ & EPA Hazardous Materials Database Information.
- FEMA 100-year floodplains.
- Vegetation Information.
- Threatened and Endangered Species Information.
- Noise Receiver Locations.

## Preparation of Environmental Document

The Engineer shall prepare environmental documentation of the level required by proposed improvements, utilizing the appropriate outline in accordance with; TxDOT's Environmental Manual, Title 23, Parts 771 and 772, FHWA's Technical Advisory T6640.8A, and TxDOT's 1996 Noise Guidelines and 1999 Air Quality Guidelines.

The Engineer will include in the document a discussion of the history of the project, the purpose and need, and the design change (the interchange at 183A and CR 274) being assessed. The document will also include an existing environment discussion, direct effects discussion, and indirect, and cumulative impacts analysis as described below.

#### Existing Environment

Through data collection and field investigation, the Engineer will prepare a description of the affected environment to serve as the basis for determining the environmental consequences of the proposed 183A/CR 274 interchange. This description will include land use, socio-economics (including identification of minority, low income, and limited English proficient (LEP) populations), farmlands, soils, noise, air quality, surface water, groundwater, wetlands, vegetation, wildlife habitat, threatened and endangered species, cultural resources, Section 4(f) properties, and hazardous materials sites.

### Direct Effects

With the information compiled on the affected environment and design and traffic data, the Engineer will determine the environmental consequences, or direct effects, of the proposed 183A/CR 274 interchange. The direct effects will be determined on the resource categories analyzed for the Existing Environment, including historic properties. The direct effects section will address potential noise and air quality impacts, including qualitative analysis of Mobile Source Air Toxics. The noise analysis will include the development of noise contours and a generalized assessment of impacts and a detailed assessment and abatement analysis for the design change assessed in the re-evaluation. The MSAT analysis will be a qualitative analysis based upon traffic projections being below the quantitative MSAT criteria threshold of 140,000

ADT. The qualitative analysis will be based upon the FHWA Interim Guidance on Air Toxic Analysis in NEPA Documents, February 3, 2006.

## Indirect Cumulative Impact (ICI) Analysis

Consistent with direction from TxDOT and FHWA, the Engineer will only assess the indirect and cumulative impacts of the 183A/CR 274 interchange location proposed in the re-evaluation. The ICI analysis will be limited to those issues pertaining to the interchange. The Engineer will review changes attributable to past roadway improvements in the area in order to project indirect effects of the proposed improvements in the re-evaluation. The Engineer will prepare the ICI analysis based upon the eight-step approach in TxDOT's Interim Guidance on Preparing Indirect and Cumulative Impact Analyses, dated December 2006. The National Cooperative Highway Research Program Report 466 (NCHRP 466) will also be used as guidance in this analysis.

Consistent with TxDOT's Interim Guidance and by direction from TxDOT and FHWA, the Engineer will perform the ICI analysis on those resources which are (1) impacted only by the proposed 183A/CR 274 interchange and (2) are currently in poor and/or declining health.

## Section 106 Consultation

The Engineer will be available to CTRMA for consultation during the Section 106 process.

If, after evaluation, and consultation under Section 106, TxDOT and FHWA determines that project activities trigger adverse effects to historic properties located in the APE, the Engineer shall in consultation with CTRMA and TxDOT, and under a supplemental agreement, perform the following services as required:

- Develop a Memorandum of Agreement between FHWA, TxDOT, ACHP, TSHPO and other consulting parties as defined by TxDOT;
- · Develop mitigation strategies for adverse impacts
- · Conduct approved mitigation activities; and
- · Section 4(f) activities.

## **Public Involvement**

The Engineer will prepare and present one (1) public hearing in support of the re-evaluation. The Engineer will attend the public hearing for the purpose of providing informational materials regarding the re-evaluation, and for gathering comments from the community-at-large, and addressing local concerns regarding the proposed 183A/CR 274 interchange. The Engineer will secure the sites for the public hearing. Site locations will be submitted to CTRMA for approval by the State prior to booking the rooms.

Additionally, the Engineer will make arrangements for a court reporter to be present at the public meeting.

The Engineer will prepare and mail meeting notices to identified stakeholders in the database, and develop and publish one (1) legal notice and one (1) display ad in preparation for the public hearing. The notices will be placed in previously identified local paper(s) 30 days and 10 days before the public hearing. Additionally, the Engineer will prepare an agenda, comment cards (up

to 500), exhibit boards (up to 2), and up to four (one page, double-sided) handouts for public use. All project boards will be printed in English, with an additional handout of the boards translated in Spanish. A Public Hearing Comment and Response Report will be prepared after the hearing to record public comment. The Engineer will respond to up to 100 comments per public hearing. Project communication materials will be approved by the State before use.

## **Project Management and Coordination**

The Engineer shall manage all activities associated with the project. The Engineer shall secure resources necessary to produce the project deliverables and meet the project schedule. All communications associated with the project will be directly channeled through the Engineer for distribution to the project team as appropriate. The Engineer shall designate one Texas Registered Professional Engineer, Laurence W. Shumway, P.E., as Project Manager to be responsible throughout the project for project management and all communications, including billing, with CTRMA and TxDOT's Project Manager.

The Engineer will be required to meet with the CTRMA and designated TxDOT project manager and other TxDOT representatives, as necessary to report on progress and to ensure all components of the project are proceeding in compliance with the scope of services and according to the project schedule. The purpose of these meetings is to evaluate the project status, determine necessary adjustments to the project work plan and schedule, plan upcoming events and to discuss and resolve project technical issues. The Engineer will prepare minutes of each meeting and circulate to all attendees.

The environmental work on this project may be inspected by CTRMA at any time in the offices of HNTB Corporation at 301 Congress Avenue, Suite 600, Austin, Texas, 78701.

## General Administration

Perform general administration duties required to maintain the project. These duties include:

- Preparation of monthly progress reports. Monthly progress reports will include:
  - Activities during the reporting period.
  - Activities planned for the following months.
  - Project action item and project schedule maintenance
  - Overall status of project.
  - Pending issues that need short-term attention.
- Record keeping and file management
- Data management and file transfers for required elements of the project.
- Quality Control/Quality Assurance

## Exclusions

The following tasks are specifically excluded from the preparation of environmental documents and not included in this work authorization, and would be scoped and detailed at a later date, as necessary:

- ICI analysis of the entire FEIS limits;
- Endangered species coordination and/or surveys;
- Biological Assessments;

- USACE 404 delineations and permit coordination;
- · Archeological survey;
- Historic/Archeological coordination involving National Register Testing and/or Data Recovery-level excavation or mitigation or Section 106 Coordination except as specifically noted and included above;
- · Hazardous materials Phase II Environmental Site Assessment;
- Additional documentation services requested as a result of a change in environmental regulations or TxDOT/FHWA documentation standards from those in practice and acceptable at the time of approval of this Work Authorization;
- Work associated with outfalls outside the project ROW after the notice to proceed is received;
- · Coordination with TCEQ.

## DELIVERABLES

The Engineer will prepare a draft re-evaluation for CTRMA for review by TxDOT-ENV (10 copies will be provided). Upon receipt of comments from TxDOT-ENV, the Engineer will prepare a second draft for submittal to FHWA (10 copies will be provided). A third and final draft will be prepared to address comments received as a result of FHWA review (20 copies will be provided to CTRMA, TxDOT-ENV, and FHWA). An updated re-evaluation will be prepared following the Public Hearing, if determined necessary based on public comment. Should a post-meeting update be necessary, the Engineer will respond to up to two sets of review comments.

WHEREAS, the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority ("CTRMA") was created pursuant to the request of Travis and Williamson Counties and in accordance with provisions of the Transportation Code and the petition and approval process established in 43 Tex. Admin. Code § 26.01, et. seq. (the "RMA Rules"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the CTRMA has been constituted in accordance with the Transportation Code and the RMA Rules; and

WHEREAS, the CTRMA identified the proposed 183-A Turnpike Project (the "Project") as its initial project in a petition filed under the RMA rules and has subsequently undertaken to cause the Project to be constructed under the terms of a Comprehensive Development Agreement; and

WHEREAS, upon the completion of the Project, it will be necessary for the CTRMA to establish certain rules and regulations regarding use of the 183-A Turnpike Project; and

WHEREAS, § 370.179 (b)(1) of the Texas Transportation Code provides that an authority such as the CTRMA may prohibit the use of or access to or from a turnpike project by a motor vehicle, bicycle, another classification or type of vehicle, or a pedestrian; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors agrees that the presence of bicycle traffic on the mainlanes of the Turnpike would pose a significant danger to both vehicular and bicycle traffic.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the CTRMA Board of Directors approves of the adoption of a regulation prohibiting the use of 183-A mainlanes by bicycles, mopeds, motor-driven cycles, and electric bicycles as defined in § 541.201 of the Transportation Code; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director and CTRMA staff are directed to cause to be installed appropriate signage reflecting such regulation upon final completion of the 183-A Turnpike Project.


# **Economic Commentary**


The month of February saw a potentially fundamental shift in the markets' assessment of risk that included an aggressive rally in rates and steepening of the yield curve, as well as a general repricing of spread sectors along with global equities. While this coincided with mixed economic reports and credit concerns about subprime mortgages, data released in February suggest that the economy continues to move at a considerably healthy pace. The unemployment rate, despite an up-tick to 4.6%, still remained at the lower end of its range in the cycle. Initial jobless claims picked up throughout the month, but could have been affected by the poor weather conditions experienced throughout the country. The mix of housing data reported for the month of January pointed further to a market that may have already bottomed. Existing home sales, which account for roughly 85% of the housing market, were up a solid 3.0%. U.S. Treasury yields fell significantly across the curve, with the two- and five-year Treasury notes down by 30 basis points (bps) and 32 bps respectively.

The Federal Reserve is expected to remain on hold through the first half of the year, with the possibility of a rate hike in the recond half. Although, it is not anticipated that the Fed will react to just one month of concerning inflation reports, it is expected they will keep a close watch on data released in coming months to determine whether the most recent increases in both the core PCE and core CPI are the start of a trend. The housing market correction is anticipated to abate by midyear, with GDP growth coming in at or above trend (2.75% - 3.0%) for the rest of the year, driven by strong personal consumption.


Portfolio by


