Austin Showcases its Creative Side with "Love My Commute Challenge"

Carma Carpooling celebrates the expansion of toll reimbursements to all Central Texas toll roads by awarding Dream Commute.



—AUSTIN, TX – March 18th, 2015 - Central Texans who used Carma Carpooling in February really loved their commute, and one carpooler just won a Dream Commute for a Month, including a Tesla, for telling his story. The "Love My Commute" Challenge encouraged Central Texans to compete by submitting creative works about carpooling with Carma, the ridesharing app that also earns its members discounts on Central Texas toll roads.

The challenge was a joint project sponsored by Carma and the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority, which is working with Carma to encourage more carpooling.

"More carpooling means fewer vehicles on our roadways, which means a better commute for all of us," said the Mobility Authority's Executive Director, Mike Heiligenstein. "The challenge was a fun way to encourage carpooling while also giving Carma users a chance to express their creative side."

The grand winner of the contest was Bradley Pierce, who entered a video called "Before/After Carma," featuring a black-and-white time-lapse of a bored driver that transitions to a colored film of an engaged driver as passengers join him for a more interesting commute. Lauren Albright of Carma turned over the keys of the Tesla to Bradley on Wednesday at the Mobility Authority offices. Also

part of the grand prize “Dream Commute” package was a brand new iPhone 6, a \$150 Starbucks gift card, and \$100 in TxTag credit.

The runners-up include Brandi Clark Burton, who also submitted a video, Samuel Qassam, who submitted a photo of a five-person carpool, Loyce Sullivan, who submitted a photo of the "Carpool Angels," Nancy Clayborne, who wrote an "Ode to Carpooling" and Adam LaRue, who wrote a Carma Haiku. “We received so many creative entries in this contest, selecting a winner was quite a challenge,” said Lauren Albright of Carma. “It was amazing to see Central Texans putting the fun back in their commute with Carma while putting empty car seats to good use!”

Users of the Carma Carpooling app currently get toll reimbursements on all Central Texas tollways through a program that has been extended until June 30, 2015.* Currently, two-person carpools using **Carma** get 50% off their tolls and three-person carpools get the full toll reimbursed.
