



Mobility Authority Policy Codes



Section 301.010(d-f): Customer Service & Violation Enforcement Policies

- Customers with 100 or more events non-payment within a period of one year and who have received at least two written notices of non-payment may be considered Habitual Violators.
 An event of non-payment is considered to be one unpaid toll transaction.
- Following a final determination that a registered owner with at least 100 unpaid toll
 violations within a year is a Habitual Violator, the Authority may report a vehicle owned or
 leased by a person determined to be a Habitual Violator to a county tax assessor-collector or
 the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles in order to cause the denial of a vehicle registration.
- By order of its Board of Directors, the Authority may prohibit the operation of a motor vehicle owned or leased by a person determined to be a Habitual Violator on all authority toll roads. Vehicles that continue to operate on a toll road after the prohibition are subject to ticketing and impounding.

HV Prohibited Vehicle Action Summary August 2024



- Approve a Vehicle Prohibition Order for the identified habitual violator customers
 - » Number of prohibited vehicles: 1,278
 - » Total number of related unpaid tolls: 388,847
 - Average number of outstanding tolls per vehicle: 304
 - Average unpaid balance: \$993.09

Next Steps

- » Customers will receive *Prohibition Order* by mail
- » Customers found to be in violation of the prohibition are subject to a warning, a citation with up to \$500 fine and / or vehicle impoundment by local law enforcement



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Interlocal Agreement Overview








- TxDOT and Mobility Authority contracted staff are co-located at the TxTag Customer Service Centers (CSCs) for the purpose of providing walk-up services to allow their respective customers to resolve TxTag and Authority toll payments and inquiries in one location
- The TxTag CSCs are open Monday Friday from 7a-7p and Saturday from 9a-2p
- There is no direct cost to the Authority for this partnership; ViaPlus provides staff and equipment through their agreement with the Mobility Authority

OPERATIONAL PERFORMANCE - STOREFRONT



- Through April 2024, CTRMA averaged 3,500 walk-in customers each month
 - Most of these visits were to the Burnet Road location
 - Visits to the Ridgepoint location increased by 300% during the same period
 - Habitual violator customer visits account for ~5% of the monthly walk-in activity





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CTRMA System Toll Revenues – Fiscal 2024










CTRMA Financial Highlights – FY 24



- System toll revenues up 5.2% over prior year; 3% over budget
- Total system revenues increased 11.7% over prior year
- Investment earnings 49.3% higher than prior year
- Project fund investments in State and Local Government demand deposits yielded added \$1.4MM CTRMA retained
- Expenses increased 8.6% over prior year; 9% below budget
- Recurring COLA for retirees resulted in pension liability
- Data platform going live resulted in intangible software asset
- MoPac toll revenues increased 16% over prior year





- On August 9, 2024, S&P raised CTRMA's credit rating from 'A' to 'A+' on the senior lien bonds.
- The subordinate lien bonds also received a rating upgrade from 'A-' to 'A.'
- The S&P outlook is stable.

Credit Highlights

- Strong Central Texas economy with growing population
- History of strong financial performance exceeding metrics
- Strong management and governance

Credit Weaknesses

- Escalating debt service that require growth in revenues
- Ongoing construction projects that could incur higher-than-forecasts costs or delays

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Traffic & Revenue Engineering Services Contracts



- Indenture of trust requires retention of these services
- Three qualified respondents to May 2024 RFQ:
 - » CDM Smith Inc.
 - » C&M Associates, Inc.
 - » Stantec Consulting Services, Inc.
- Board authorized Executive Director to negotiate contracts
- Same terms for all three contracts
 - » Five-year duration, with two optional two-year extensions
 - » Annual work authorizations contemplated to identify Authority needs and plan for budget resources
- Specialty work contemplated for FY 25 include:
 - » Pay By Mail procurement
 - » Managed lane toll policy

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Texas Municipal League (TML) Cyber Fund



- CTRMA has had cyber liability policy with TML since 2016
- The policy covers certain cyber and data breach response claims within established limits
- Due to a rise in claims, the TML Board has established a separate Cyber Fund effective October 1, 2024
 - » Fund will pay up to \$25MM in total claims annually
 - » Two aggregate coverage options: \$500,000 and \$1MM
 - » Coverage includes cyber liability and data breach response subject to plan limits for types of claims
- Participants must elect coverage through an executed interlocal agreement by September 30, 2024
- Staff recommends \$1MM coverage level

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Background




- Pre-paid electronic toll collection, such as transponders (aka "tags"), are the most efficient way to facilitate payment for travel on tolled facilities
 - » Benefits for customers: lower tolls rates, avoidance of administrative fees for late payments, and legal consequences of nonpayment
 - » Benefits for the Mobility Authority: lower cost to collect, faster revenue realization, and the mitigation of toll violations
- In 2020 the Mobility Authority experienced a decline in the number of customers using pre-paid toll payment methods and an increase in the number of Pay By Mail invoices issued
 - More customers using electronic toll payment methods is needed to reverse this trend

Pre-paid Penetration Historical Trends




By Calendar Year: 2013-2024

 The Interlocal Agreement provides access to the TRIPS module of NTTA's back-office system; training; issue resolution support; TollTag® marketing collateral development; and NTTA consulting services on marketing and related activities



- Compensation will be set per Work Authorization for the desired applicable services
- The term is for two years with automatic renewal for successive one (1) year periods unless terminated

Staff Recommendation



- Staff recommends approval of the Interlocal Agreement between the Mobility Authority and NTTA for TollTag® marketing and distribution services
- If approved, next steps include:
 - » training CTRMA representatives to allow for TollTag[®] account signups and account modifications;
 - » finalization and implementation of a Central Texas-focus TollTag® marketing plan; and
 - » exploration of additional opportunities to convert Pay By Mail customers to TollTag® account holders



 - » Provide GEC Oversight
 - » Procure and contract Design Engineers, Construction Contract, and Construction Oversight by Mobility Authority policy
 - » Coordinate Utility Relocations
- Travis County Responsibility:
 - » Fund, Review, and Permit Projects
 - » Acquire Right-of-Way

TRAVIS COUNTY 2023 BOND PROGRAM



- Revisions to new proposed ILA from previous Mobility Authority/Travis County Agreements:
 - » 4.65% Administrative Fee for Mobility Authority staff efforts
 - Increased from 2% in current agreements
 - » Controlled Mobility Authority potential liabilities for Engineering and Construction Contracts
 - » Legal coordination processes for potential disputes or claims
 - » More independence for Mobility Authority to administer construction contract change orders


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
Monthly Transaction Trend by Roadway







